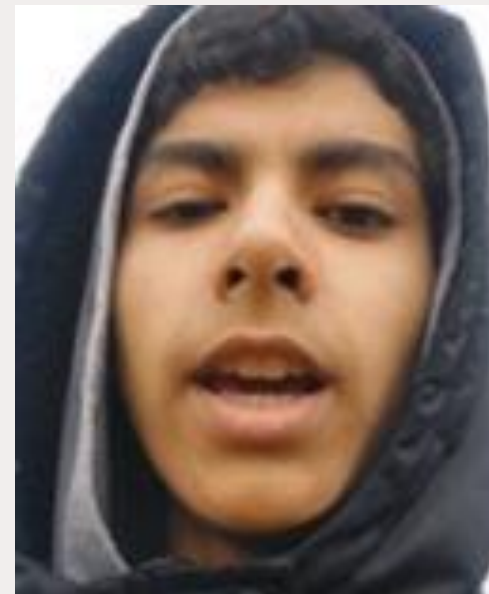

## Knife Attack On Youth

On the night of 2 to 3 March 2023, an orthodox Jew (50) was targeted by a young Muslim boy, 15, with a knife, in Selnau, Zurich, Switzerland. During the incident, the assailant shouted “Death to the Jews” and “Death to Israel.” The victim sustained serious injuries from eight stabs and was admitted to intensive care for medical attention. Before the attack, the 15-year-old attacker recorded a video swearing allegiance to the Islamic State (IS) Caliph Abu Hafs al-Hashimi al-Qurashi.





# Hacked ATC Attempted to Guide an El Al Flight to a Dangerous Area Over Somalia

Hostile elements attempted to take over the communication network of an El Al plane flying from Phuket to Ben-Gurion Airport on Saturday night and divert it from its destination, Israel's national airline confirmed on Sunday.

During the incident, instructions were given to the crew that were different from their set route, raising concerns that someone was trying to damage the plane or lead it to dangerous areas, maybe even to conduct a kidnapping. The crew disobeyed the instructions and quickly switched to alternative means of communication while also checking the data against other air traffic controllers and realizing that they were being misled.





# Facial Recognition: Coming Soon to an Airport Near You



On a recent Thursday morning in Queens, travelers streamed through the exterior doors of La Guardia Airport's Terminal C. Some were bleary-eyed – most hefted briefcases – as they checked bags and made their way to the security screening lines. It was business as usual, until some approached a line that was almost empty. One by one, they walked to a kiosk with an iPad affixed to it and had their photos taken, as a security officer stood by. Within seconds, each passenger's image was matched to a photo from a government database, and the traveler was ushered past security into the deeper maze of the airport. No physical ID or boarding pass required.

# Consignment of Banned Drugs Seized at Srinagar Airport

The Drug Control Department along with airport and sales taxes department on Wednesday seized a consignment containing 190 strips of psychotropic drug at Srinagar International Airport. Irfana Ahmad, Joint Drugs Controller said they received a tip off that a consignment of drugs had arrived at Srinagar Airport. “Our drug control officer along with the sales tax department and airport authorities seized a courier containing 190 strips of ‘Tapentadol tablets,’” she said. Ahmad added that it is an unregulated drug and has come through an unregulated channel and they are investigating the matter.





## 12 Passengers Detained With Gold Inside Body Cavity at Lucknow Airport



On Saturday, outside terminal one (T1) of Chaudhary Charan Singh International Airport (CCSIA), alert cops detained 12 passengers hiding gold inside their body cavity. Interestingly, these dozen suspects were among 19 passengers who were detained by customs sleuths on the same morning with Rs 1.40 crore worth cigarettes and pan masala at the airport while they were attempting to smuggle the consignment inside the country.

According to sources, all the accused are couriers of smuggling cartel and hail from Tanda area of Rampur district. Speaking to TOI, Jag Prasad the sub-inspector of airport police outpost said, “Following a tip-off we had detained a total of 14 suspects outside T1 who came to Lucknow from Abu Dhabi and Sharjah. During questioning, 12 admitted to having gold concealed in their body cavity either by swallowing the gold paste concealed in capsule form or hiding the capsule in their rectum.”

# Passenger Arrested at Karachi Airport Over Fake Visa

The Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) immigration on Thursday apprehended a passenger – having a counterfeit visa – who arrived at Jinnah International Airport, Karachi from Iran, ARY News reported. The preliminary investigation revealed that the passenger, named Tayyab Hussain, went to Iran through an illegal route and arrived at Karachi airport from an international flight FZ-335. However, immigration authorities detained the passenger upon discovering a counterfeit Iraqi visa affixed to his passport. The law enforcers revealed that the accused obtained a visa to Iraq from an agent in exchange for Rs 300,000, meanwhile, the authorities found no prior international travel record of the accused. The FIA spokesperson stated that a case has been registered against the accused and the individual has been transferred to the Anti-Human Trafficking Circle Karachi for further investigation.

# UK Immigration Chief Inspector Sacked Amid Row Over Security Checks at Airports

The British borders and immigration watchdog, David Neal, has been sacked after he “lost the confidence of the Home Secretary,” the Home Office said. Mr. Neal “breached” the terms of his appointment and was informed his time in post was being immediately terminated on Tuesday, according to the government department. It comes after Mr. Neal and the Home Office became embroiled in a public row about concerns he was raising over security checks at airports. A Home Office spokesman said in a statement, “We have terminated the appointment of David Neal, the independent chief inspector of Borders and Immigration, after he breached the terms of appointment and lost the confidence of the Home Secretary.”
